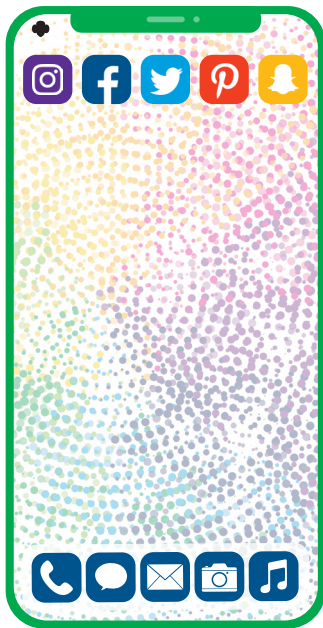

Important Information for Girl Programs

Who can attend?

- Any currently registered member of GSNEO may participate in council-sponsored programs and events specific to their current age level.
- Girls may participate individually or as part of a troop. Adult chaperones are required unless otherwise noted.
- Family and friends are welcome to attend “Family-Friendly” programs and events.

Get registered!

- GSNEO uses an online registration system. First time visitors must become a registered user by creating a profile and password.
- Payment is due at the time of registration using credit or debit cards, or GSNEO Pathway Passes.
- Registrations that can be accommodated after the close date will incur a \$5 late fee per person.
- Programs are filled on a first-registered, first-served basis. The online system indicates program capacity and remaining spaces available, as well as a waitlist.
- Waitlist openings are dependent on cancellations and are not a guarantee of being placed in a program.

Need financial assistance?

- Families that have a financial need may apply once per year for Scoutship assistance. Girls must be currently registered members to qualify. For more information and the application, visit [gsneo.org > customer care](https://gsneo.org/customer-care).

Refunds & cancellations

- A full refund of the program fee will be given ONLY if the program is canceled by GSNEO.
- A partial refund may be granted for medical or family emergencies. Submit written requests for refunds no later than two weeks after the program date to registration@gsneo.org.

Pathway Passes

Pathway Passes are rewards earned by girls through participation in council-sponsored product sales programs. Codes for earned passes are delivered electronically. Retrieve your codes at rewards.gsneo.org.

- Only redeemable for girl program registration fees.
- Must be applied for payment at the time of registration.
- May be used one time only.
- Multiple codes must be entered by using commas between them.

Want to start a babysitting business? Become First Aid/CPR/AED certified, learn childcare techniques, and understand how to start your own business! Practice caring for babies using an infant simulator. Fee includes American Red Cross blended learning First Aid/CPR/AED certifications, meals and snacks, and a babysitting starter kit. Completes some of the requirements for the Cadette Babysitting and First Aid badges. Badges must be purchased separately. This is a two-day, overnight program. All meals and snacks are provided. Adult fee includes the cost of meals and snacks. Adult chaperones assist with basic classroom management, overnight management, and meal preparation.

Note: When registering a Girl Scout for this course, please use your Girl Scout's own, unique email address. This is important as the American Red Cross system recognizes all email addresses that have been used in their system. If your Girl Scout

does not have an email account, they must create one. Your Girl Scout will be emailed, reminded, and informed by the American Red Cross through this email address and will be responsible for their own class. One week before class, participants will be emailed a link to complete the online portion of the American Red Cross blended learning First Aid/CPR/AED certification. Prepare for the in-person skills test by completing the online portion of simulated learning course virtually—the virtual course must be completed prior to attending the in-person session. After completion, a certificate will be issued to proceed to the in-person skills test. Bring a printed or digital copy of this certificate of completion to the class. Participants cannot attend the class without this proof of completion. Participants must be 13+ years old and physically have the upper body strength and stamina to correctly complete the repetitive and consecutive chest compression cycles required in CPR.

The Girl Scout Gold Award is the mark of the truly remarkable. Through pursuing the Gold Award, Girl Scouts change the world by tackling issues they are passionate about to drive lasting change in their communities and beyond while they learn essential skills that will prepare them for all aspects of life. As a bonus, the Gold Award opens doors to a variety of scholarships, preferred admission tracks for college, strong networking, amazing career opportunities, and much more.

Go for the Gold trains you on everything you need to know about earning your Gold Award at Girl Scouts of North East Ohio by breaking down the process into seven sequential self-led modules. You can work on these modules at your own pace and even go back and review them at any time. Completing all seven Go for the Gold training modules in gsLearn is a required prerequisite before going for your Gold Award. Sign up for the month in which you want to gain access to the seven Go for the Gold modules in gsLearn.

Provide the email address to which you want the information on how to access the modules sent. **You will be emailed the instructions during the week you register for.** After you gain access to the modules, there is not a specific time limit in which you must complete them. You can work on the modules at your own pace, but all 7 modules must be completed before going for your Gold Award.

Greater Cleveland Aquarium: Animal Observations

Dive into an adventure observing the incredible animals at the Greater Cleveland Aquarium! Use your eyes to spot certain frogs remaining still and blending in, while others hop around the damp forest floor. Use your ears to listen for birds calling and communicating with each other. Touch a sea urchin to see if it's as spiky as it appears. Every animal has a story to tell, and you can use your senses to uncover the mysteries. As part of the self-guided tour, use materials provided by the Aquarium to track the movements and behaviors of the Sand Tiger sharks! This program complements some parts of the Animal Observer badge. Badge must be purchased separately.



Note: Each program begins with a 45-minute classroom component facilitated by an aquarium educator. During the remaining 75 minutes, you will have an opportunity to discover the fun the aquarium has to offer with materials provided by the education team to enhance self-guided, 'on your own' time!

Registration for this program includes admission to the aquarium, so stay and enjoy the exhibits following the program.

Join us on an expedition through the aquatic biome at the Greater Cleveland Aquarium. Investigate all kinds of underwater habitats including vibrant coral reefs and cold kelp forests, and discover what makes these dwellings unique and special. Explore how animals adapt to life in these vastly different habitats across the earth, and how we can protect these places and creatures for future generations to enjoy.
